**SUBJECT:** APA Comparative Cost Report Analysis FY2019

The City Auditor's Office has completed an analysis of the FY2019 Virginia Auditor of Public Accounts (APA) Comparative Report of Local Government Revenues and Expenditures.

We obtained information from the APA report and performed further analysis to compare the City of Richmond with similar cities in the Commonwealth with populations of approximately 100,000 or more, as well as Arlington County, Virginia. These particular localities were chosen to provide relative benchmarks due to similar services provided by larger more urban localities. This analysis is provided to the Administration and City Council for reference and continued analysis of possible improvement opportunities.

This work provides an objective summary of information from the APA's report. This summary was completed as a non-audit service and does not constitute an audit conducted in accordance with Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards (GAGAS).



## **FY2019 ANALYSIS SUMMARY**

The charts and schedules that follow show a high level ranking amongst various categories from the FY19 Comparative Cost Report. Please note that numbers in the charts and graphs have been rounded to the nearest dollar which can cause minor differences when summed.

The chart and table below represent the Local Revenue per capita for Fiscal Year 2019. As the APA noted "the report provides a uniform presentation of fiscal information; however, we caution users not to base conclusions solely on this report's data." Therefore this information should not be used solely as an indicator of efficiency or performance without further analysis of the scope of services among those entities being ranked.







## **FY2019 ANALYSIS BY FUNCTIONAL AREAS**





Richmond ranked in the middle of the seven and just above the average of approximately \$197. Figures for FY2019 General Government Administration costs show a decrease of \$71 over the FY2018 cost per capita figure of \$271. The primary cause of the decrease is a re-categorization of non-departmental expenses that in 2018 were included with General Government Administration. In 2019, these expenses were reclassified to other categories for the APA form reports that better fit, in terms of functions.







Richmond ranked the highest of the seven and approximately \$91 above the average of \$326. Based on the documentation provided by the Administration, the numbers for Richmond Public Works' Buildings and Grounds include approximately \$1.5 million in grounds maintenance costs for Parks and Recreation. This raises Public Works cost per capita and reduces Parks and Recreation cost per capita by \$7.





Richmond ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest of the seven and well below the average of approximately \$196. Based on the documentation provided by the Administration, the numbers for Richmond Public Works' Buildings and Grounds include approximately \$1.5 million in grounds maintenance costs for Parks and Recreation. This raises Public Works cost per capita and reduces Parks and Recreation cost per capita by \$7.

Richmond ranked the highest of the seven and well above the average of approximately \$228. The primary cost driver for the cost per capita (\$506) for Richmond is the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority (RRHA) with \$64.7 million of the \$114.8 million reported for this category. RRHA has other revenues that offset these expenses.

Richmond ranked the highest of the seven and well above the average of approximately \$8,261. Richmond's Enterprise activities are a primary reason debt per capita is higher, and this debt is supported by user fees. Enterprise activities also serve customers outside of the city limits but in the Richmond region, which can be a factor for this cost. The table to the right shows that General Government debt service to capita to be in the middle of the range for the seven.
