1	Addison	N	BPOL Surplus	Any surplus revenues above the project FY 2022 business, professional, and occupational license tax revenues shall be invested in a future rate reduction commensurate with the annual surplus until the rate is 20 cents per 100 dollars of gross receipts for "financial, real estate & professional services," and "personal or business services."
2	Addison	N	Fiscal Review Savings	Any savings identified by the Office of the City Auditor as a result of the funded fiscal review must be dedicated toward improving working conditions within City offices, including but not limited to staff additions, technology improvements, salary supplements and increases, and new staff trainings and related-skills building.
3	Addison	N	Permitting Special Revenue Fund	With the exception of the levy imposed pursuant to § 36-137, any fees levied pursuant to this subsection (B. New construction and C. Existing buildings and structures) shall be placed in a Permitting Special Reserve Fund and used only to support the functions of the local building department. Code of Virginia § 36-105. Enforcement of Code; appeals from decisions of local department; inspection of buildings; inspection warrants; inspection of elevators; issuance of permits. "Local building department" means the agency or agencies of any local governing body charged with the administration, supervision, or enforcement of the Building Code and regulations, approval of plans, inspection of buildings, or issuance of permits, licenses, certificates or similar documents. 4	Addison	N	Virginia Retirement System	New City of Richmond hires shall be placed in the Virginia Retirement System effective July 1, 2022. Eligible existing employees shall be offered the opportunity to transition back into the Virginia Retirement System.
5	Addison	N	Office of Sustainability	Make the Office of Sustainability an independent office, separate from the Department of Public Works.
6	Lynch	N	Citizens Review Board/IG	Place the Citizen Review Board in the Inspector General's office for the first year then review.
7	Lynch	N	IG Contract Procurement	Place IG Contract Inspector within the Procurement Department. This should be reviewed at the 18 month mark.
8	Lynch	N	Procurement Bids	Review procurement policies to allow for department to justify accepting bids that may not be the lowest.
9	Lynch	N	Reservation Fund Balance	Reservation of fund balance of \$847,000 to be used for permanent supportive housing.
10	Lynch	N	Southside Revitalization	Support recommendations for the Southside Revitalization Task Force Plan through rezoning.
11	Lynch	N	Specialty Dockets	Increase funding for specialty dockets (Mental Health & Drug Dockets) to reduce recidivism. Funding should evaluate the programs, outcomes, and development recommendations to increase program retention and participation
12	Lynch	N	Vegetation Ordinance	Request the Planning Department review staffing to have entry level inspectors handle the vegetation ordinances.
13	Lynch	N	Charter Commission	Create a Commission to review the City Charter.
14	Robertson	N	Collaborative Budget Process	A text amendment requiring that the adoption of the budget requires a collaborative SOP to include work sessions which result in an agreed upon budget of all additional recovery funds coming to the City. The SOP should be to Council before receiving any funds.
15	Jordon	N	Office of Sustainability	Make the Office of Sustainability an independent office, separate from the Department of Public Works.
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
